Foreword Cervical cancer is the fourth most frequent cancer in women, with an estimated 570,000 new cases in 2018 representing 66% of all female cancers. Approximately 90% of deaths from cervical cancer occurred in low and middle-income

4 Your Guide to Cervical Cancer • Adenocarcinoma More than 1 in 10 (more than 10%) cervical cancers are adenocarcinomas. This type of cancer affects the cells that line the cervical canal (glandular cells). Less common types include mixed adenosquamous cancers, neuroendocrine tumours, clear cell cancers, and small or large cell cancers.

5 ESMO Patients Guide Early-stage cervical cancer - Women with early-stage invasive disease normally undergo surgery to remove the cancer. A hysterectomy is usually offered, and some pelvic lymph nodes may also be removed. - Patients who are considered to be at high risk of the cancer recurring may be given adjuvant chemoradiotherapy after their surgery.

into cancer. Cervical cancer usually develops from abnormal cells that have been present for many years. There are other factors that increase the risk of developing cervical cancer. The most common include smoking, a weakened immune system (such as women who have HIV or have had an organ transplantation) and taking

- Being infected with human papillomavirus (HPV). This is the most important risk factor for cervical cancer.
- Being exposed to the drug DES (diethylstilbestrol) while in the mother's womb.

In women who are infected with HPV, the following risk factors add to the increased risk of cervical cancer:
