improvement in the baby will be an increase in heart rate Consider the need for help; if needed, ask for help immediately A healthy baby will be born blue but will have good tone, will cry within a few seconds of delivery and will have a good heart rate within a few minutes of birth (the heart rate of a healthy newborn baby is about 120-150 min⁻¹)

Having meaningful conversations with mothers

The way a baby is parented can have a long-term impact on his development When babies are brought up in loving, nurturing environments they are more likely to become confident and secure adults Encouraging mothers to think about their baby's need for closeness, comfort and love and reassuring them that responsive

What to expect after vaccinations

After a vaccination, your baby may cry for a little while, but that usually settles soon with a cuddle or a feed Most babies don't have any other reaction Reactions at the site of the injection Some babies have some swelling, redness or a small hard lump where the injection was given and it may be sore to touch This usually only lasts

TB, BCG vaccine

The Science of Hearing The human hearing range is between 20 to 20,000 Hz There is considerable variation in the hearing range between individuals Most young people can hear up to 18,000 Hz Our ability to hear high frequencies declines with age By the age of 55 some men can't hear above 5,000 Hz and some women can't hear above 12,000 Hz
